ACTIVITIES TO FOLLOW SIGNUPS

As you likely know, we filled out papers a couple of weeks ago asking you what all you are willing to take part in, in terms of activities and ministries. There was a pretty good positive response for this, and I appreciate young willingness to be involved. We have pretty much put together the list of who has volunteered. In the next few weeks, we will be getting into different meetings and activities;

In terms of ministries done in mass (i.e. lector, server, Eucharistic minister, etc.), we will soon be coming out with a 3-month schedule, the way we had done before the outbreak. We have some new people for these and have lost some older people, and there will only be one of most ministries for each mass (under current restrictions), but we will still need people. As for things like art and environment, and building and grounds, there is no reason to not have meetings for this. There have been a few projects that have been put on the back burner that we can address with both of these.

We will once again be resuming homebound ministries to the elderly each Sunday, assuming that a given elderly person is open to receiving visits from us. As for Fellowship Café and Jail Ministry, that could be a while yet. All we can do on that area is wait until current restrictions are lifted. The Social Committee is also planning events now, based on what we are able to do. Various social activities, such as Men's breakfast, Women's group, Youth Ministry and Young Adult group, do have the opportunity to meet in some form, as creative solutions allow.

Bingo is going full swing at the Knights of Columbus Hall, so we can use help with that. A new thing we are starting is a Bereavement Group, particularly for those who have lost loved ones. This will be forming soon, and information will follow. Another new thing we are starting is a Welcoming Committee, to welcome those people who have recently started coming to our churches. This has been talked about for a long time, and is a much-needed ministry.

It is not time for us to, in large part, start getting back to life as normal as possible. I have to admit, I myself have somewhat been in lazy mode, and I am trying to crawl out of this. May all we do glorify the Lord.

DISCIPLES RESPONSE SUNDAY COMING SOON

"Which of the two did his father's will?"

This is a parable that every parent should be able to cite and recite at a moment's notice -frequently. It captures the true meaning of the difference between honesty and dishonesty, good and evil. There are very few of us who have agreed or promised to do something and then failed to do so. Sometimes we forget. Sometimes we get overwhelmed by other events or emergencies and cannot make the time to do what we promised. But sometimes we commit to do something and have no intention to fulfill that commitment. And then there are the occasions when we refuse to do something, then reconsider and do what we have been asked. Jesus knew that when we truly open ourselves to God in prayer we may hear Him ask us to do something we are not willing to do. But when we are being good stewards of our prayer and continue to be open to God's will for us, we will do God's will regardless of the challenge of consequences. It is then that we are honest, good and righteous.
