Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time October 11, 2020

<u>ALL ST PAUL WEEKEND MASSES OUTDOORS</u>: Until further notice mass at St. Paul will be outdoors on both Saturday and Sunday. We will continue to do this as long as the weather allows us to do so.
