We have even had to hire another teaching position to accommodate this huge jump in enrollment, and there is talk of the possibility of putting an addition on the school.

But beyond that, there has been a great spirit in our school this year. The masses have been far less of a celebration, because of the masks that we wear, but we are still able to bring the sacraments to our kids who. The principal Chris Reed continues to bring new innovations to our school. I have to say that this is one of the most satisfying years we have had since I have been here. The parents and children have been pleased with things this year. I want to just thank the Lord for all of the blessings that he has given us this year

THOUGHTS ON PRAYING THE ROSARY THIS MONTH

Just as Mothers Day is a day that should not be needed (since we are supposed to honor our mother every day of the year), so October is a month that we shuld not need to focus on the rosary, but the reality is that we do need it. ALL ST PAUL WEEKEND MASSES OUTDOORS: Until further notice mass at St. Paul will be outdoors on both Saturday and Sunday. We will continue to do this as long as the weather allows us to do so.
