Pastor's Corner

The Baptism of the Lord January 10, 2021

WHAT DOES YOUR BAPTISM STILL MEAN TO YOU TODAY

Years ago, for most of you, you were entered into the faith through the waters of Baptism. Let us look at the formula that is used for this:

FORM A:

- 1) Do you reject Satan?
- 2) And all his works?
- 3) And all his empty promises

FORM B:

- 1) Do you renounce sin, so as to live inthe freedom of the children of God/?
- 2) Do you renounce the lure of evil, so that sin may have no mastery over you?
- 3) Do you renounce Satan, the author and prince of sin?

BOTH FORMS

- 4) Do you believe in God the Father....
- 5) Do you believe in Jesus Christ....
- 6) Do you believe in the Holy Spirit, the Church, etc.

I find it interesting how these two different forms compliment each other, and yet are very different. The one is simple and blunt. Essentially, it all forms on one question: Do you reject Satan? And if you reject Satan, you reject his works. The other one is more descriptive. It essentially says that you reject sin and evil, and thus you reject the hold that sin has on you. Finally, it gets around to saying, "oh, by the way, do you reject the guy who brought us sin?" I go back and forth on which of these I prefer. One is to reject a person himself, that being Satan. The other focusses on rejecting the WORKS of Satan. Either way, it is important to realize that this way of life, namely sin, must be rejected outright and intentionally first. We must say no to this.

If is only after saying no to Satan and evil that we are asked to give ourselves to God. But this is because it goes in order of GRADUATED importance. The motivation of it all is primarily in what we ACCEPT, that being God. If we do not accept God, then it is empty and meaningless to reject the evil that keeps us away from God. The two are ultimately two sides of the same coin. Reject Satan, accept God.

That is how it is with our faith once we start living the baptized life. It must be filled with the joy of knowing that we are one with Jesus, Christ, King of the Universe, who lowered himself to be with us. This joy is the mark of all saints, that they know how life is better with the Lord. Yet at the same time, we must be constantly aware that behind this is lurking a danger of what can happen to us, that in the end we must either choose salvation with the Lord, or damnation with Satan. There is no third choice. Let us pray that we can all continue to live out our baptized life, that we are all called to carry out with Jesus
