### LIVESTREAMING- A GOOD IDEA WHO'S TIME IS PASSING

In the year since the Coronavirus has been an issue, this has at times been the ONLY method that our parish has had to communicate. Only two weeks after the initial outbreak, masses were broadcast 5 days a week via livestream. It has gotten us through RCIA meetings, CCD classes, about a quarter of the school year at St. Paul School, parish council meetings, marriage preparation, even fundraisers. It has actually been downright fun to do Bible study as well as our Reverse Raffle via livestream, a completely new and unique experience. One of the unique elements of livestreaming was Morning Prayer with Sister Ann Michelle. This beloved nun who had virtually nothing to do with technology beforehand, took great joy in being able to broadcast the Liturgy of the Hours every morning at 10 AM. I have to admit I enjoyed it too. Sadly, Sister's last breath was taken as she crossed the street to film Morning Prayer that fateful day in August. When school began, we were forced to switch from Morning Prayer to Evening prayer, and we relied mostly on our secretaries to take over Sister Anne Michelle's place.

While this was helpful, even necessary, the reality is that livestreaming is only a shadow of being there in person, whether it be for prayer, mass, meetings, or whatever. Like the toys we had as children, it is meant to give way to greater things. Starting on Monday, we will be having exactly nine more days of livestreaming evening prayer. Along with evening prayer, to be broadcast every evening at 5 PM from April 12-20, we will be doing a novena to St. Thomas Aquinas. After that, we will discontinue the livestreaming of Morning Prayer. The coronavirus situation is such that we now aim to being there in person. Will we replace it by a live, in-person Liturgy of the Hours. Well, that is up to the parish.

Meanwhile, livestreaming mass will soon be discontinued. No date has yet been set, but what had once been a necessary, and at times the only, form of participation in the sacraments, has now given way to opportunities for people to participate physically in mass in one way or another. The number of those tuning in has become negligible, and people are by and large able to return to mass, even if it is only on the weekdays.

The same is now true with CCD classes as well. Being as our students are now back in classes 5 days a week, the need for virtual CCD classes has now run its course. Soon, there will be live youth group available

While I am glad that we had livestream all this time, I am glad to see it go. Yes, we still do have to continue with precautions such as masks and distancing, it is good to be able to see people in person, even if I can't usually see their entire face. And yes, we will continue to have 7 AM mass at St. Paul until further notice. No change there at this time.

We continue to do all that we can to follow Coronavirus protocol, both in our church and in our school. I pray that we will now be able to aim toward more personal community life. It's time has come

**NEW MASS TIME ON MONDAY MORNING**: Because of a shift in coronavirus protocol, we cannot, for the rest of the school year, allow the public to be at either Monday or Thursday morning masses. To compensate for this, we will be offering mass on Monday at 9 AM also, for the public. This is an experimental trial. If there is interest in this, we will continue this until the end of school year.

<u>PARISH COUNCIL NOMINATIONS</u>: At the entrance of church (both churches) we will have a box to put nominations for Parish council. Half of our parish council people will be stepping down as of July, and we will need four more people from each parish. We ask you to prayerfully consider who would be a good candidate for this position. Elections will be in May. You may nominate yourself or someone else.

**BIBLE STUDY CONTINUES**: We will have our FINAL Bible study this coming Thursday at 6:30 PM, (NOTE THE CHANGE IN TIME) at St. Elizabeth. It will also be livestreamed. The topic for this class is "Bible verses that every Catholic needs to know."

**SALE OF RELIGIOUS ARTICLES COMING UP**: On the weekends of April 10/11 and April 17/18, there will a sale of religious articles (rosaries, crosses, metals, etc.) after all masses, as we have done in the past. This is a fundraiser for St. Paul School, and will be done just in time for First Communion and Confirmation.

CHANGE IN CCD SCHEDULE AT ST. PAUL: On the CCD schedule, it originally said that there would be an Easter egg hunt on Sunday the 18<sup>th</sup>. Unfortunately, due to present restrictions, we will not be able to do this hunt. Instead, we will simply resume with regular CCD class on the 18<sup>th</sup>. The last day of classes, at both churches, will be May 2. We apologize for the inconvenience.

**FIRST COMMUNION COMING UP:** First Communion will be celebrated on Sunday, May 9, at the 8:30 AM mass at St. Paul, and at the 10:30 Mass at St. Elizabeth. Each child will receive first communion in their own parish. We encourage (not as a mandate, but as request) people who do not have a child or connection among the first communion children to go to another mass besides the 8:30 mass at St. Paul, so as to not overload the attendance at these masses.

**FIRST RECONCILIATION**: We will be having first reconciliation for children from both churches on Sunday, May 2, at St. Paul Church, at 1:30 PM.

**CONFIRMATION**: Confirmation will be held this year as a joint St. Paul/St. Elizabeth mass, at the request of Bishop Medley. This will be held at a special time at 12:30 PM, at St. Elizabeth Church. Let us pray for all of our young people who are preparing for this sacrament.
