### Pastor's Corner

Third Sunday of Easter April 18, 2021

#### ST PAUL SCHOOL- EXPANDING OUT OF CONTROL

I have probably already said too much about this, but I will say a bit more. Who would have ever thought that this would be happening. Our little school out in the country that once had all of 18 kids in it, is just exploding these days. This school which was, about 12 years ago, one vote away from closing, is now projected to be somewhere in the low 90's in enrollment for this coming year. These are numbers not seen since somewhere around 1990, and for the first time in decades we will no longer be the "smallest school in the diocese" (though honestly I always kind of liked that distinction). The reality is that, for the second straight year, we will likely have to turn away prospective students (something that I really do not like to do). Fact is, this is something of a burden on our parishes finances. Some may not like this. But the reality is, lie a couple having more than three kids, every kid presents a burden, but every kid presents, even more so, a great blessing

To what do we attribute this growth? Some might say they are here because of the corona virus. Fact is, we have pretty much been in school the whole year, whereas the other local schools have not. That is good, and that has attracted people to our school this past year in ways they would not have otherwise done. But once they have stepped in the door, they have seen the good things going on, and pretty much ALL of them will be staying as a result. Some would say it is the work that our new principal, Chris Reed, has done. Certainly, he has brought so much new innovation, resources, contacts and academic success to our school, and we are blessed to have him.

Some might even say that I myself have made the school grow. People who say this have little idea what limited resources, ideas, talent and gifts I bring to the table, and my effect has been, at best, a propped-up façade. Some might also point to the fact that certain teachers and parents have brought their own talents and concern for making this a better school. There is certainly some truth in this, and I could list those parents and teachers, as well as volunteers, who have given so much to make what this school is.

But let us not pat ourselves on the back too much. The reality is that, if the new numbers at the school have done, and will do, anything good it is because we, as a community, as a faculty and as a church, have allowed the Lord in the door, and let Him do the incredible things that only He can do. It was the Lord who sent me here, and if I have had any positive effect, it is only in the fact that I have opened that door, a door that had often been locked to even Jesus himself, to allow Him to work. It is the Lord who saved this school from being closed, and the Lord who has sent Chris Reed and one faculty member after another to us, often despite the fact that this was not in their plans at all.

Thanks to the 4 parish council members who gave a yes vote to the school. Without you, the Lord would have had the door slammed in His face. But all that has happened is nothing short of a bunch of weak humans allowing Jesus Christ in to what we are doing. To Him be the glory and the credit. Now that we have grown, let us use it for His glory.

**FR STEVE WILL BE GONE THIS WEEK**. Fr will be gone from April 20-27 to visit with family. Our loyal secretaries will still be having the usual office hours, and Fr. Tony Shonis, a recently retired priest with the Diocese of Owensboro, will be filling in for weekend masses only. Because of the visiting priest, mass on Saturday, April 24 will be inside. Outdoor masses on Saturday will resume when Fr. Steve returns.

**ST. PAUL LADIES GROUP**: The Ladies Group will meet, weather permitting, outside under the porch at the Parish Hall on Wednesday, April 21st at 5:30 PM. We will be having Pie & Prayers, pie will be furnished.

**NEW MASS TIME ON MONDAY MORNING**: Because of a shift in coronavirus protocol, we cannot, for the rest of the school year, allow the public to be at either Monday or Thursday morning masses. To compensate for this, we will be offering mass on Monday at 9 AM also, for the public. This is an experimental trial. If there is interest in this, we will continue this until the end of school year.

<u>PARISH COUNCIL NOMINATIONS</u>: At the entrance of church (both churches) we will have a box to put nominations for Parish council. Half of our parish council people will be stepping down as of July, and we will need four more people from each parish. We ask you to prayerfully consider who would be a good candidate for this position. Elections will be in May. You may nominate yourself or someone else.

YARD SALE COMING UP IN JUNE: On June 4 and 5, St. Paul will once again be having It's yard sale. We take pretty much anything, except old TV's. Those who are doing Spring cleaning might want to start saving up your things to throw away.

**SALE OF RELIGIOUS ARTICLES COMING UP**: On the weekends of April 10/11 and April 17/18, there will a sale of religious articles (rosaries, crosses, metals, etc.) after all masses, as we have done in the past. This is a fundraiser for St. Paul School, and will be done just in time for First Communion and Confirmation.

CHANGE IN CCD SCHEDULE AT ST. PAUL: On the CCD schedule, it originally said that there would be an Easter egg hunt on Sunday the 18<sup>th</sup>. Unfortunately, due to present restrictions, we will not be able to do this hunt. Instead, we will simply resume with regular CCD class on the 18<sup>th</sup>. The last day of classes, at both churches, will be May 2. We apologize for the inconvenience.

FIRST COMMUNION COMING UP: First Communion will be celebrated on Sunday, May 9, at the 8:30 AM mass at St. Paul, and at the 10:30 Mass at St. Elizabeth. Each child will receive first communion in their own parish. We encourage (not as a mandate, but as request) people who do not have a child or connection among the first communion children to go to another mass besides the 8:30 mass at St. Paul, so as to not overload the attendance at these masses.

**<u>FIRST RECONCILIATION</u>**: We will be having first reconciliation for children from both churches on Sunday, May 2, at St. Paul Church, at 1:30 PM.

**CONFIRMATION**: Confirmation will be held this year as a joint St. Paul/St. Elizabeth mass, at the request of Bishop Medley. This will be held at a special time at 12:30 PM, at St. Elizabeth Church. Let us pray for all of our young people who are preparing for this sacrament.
