Mass Intentions – How Does It Work & Why It's Important

Hi all, Amy here!! Apparently, Father Steve gets worried when I write the Secretary's Corner, he's afraid of such topics as "Top Ten Reasons I Want to Throw Father Steve Out the Window" or "Why I Don't Get Paid Enough – A Case Study." But I've learned enough to know that I would be countered next week with "101 Reasons I want to Throw Amy Out the Window" so I'll just talk about Mass Intentions and call it a day!

Firstly, how I handle mass intentions that people ask for. If there is a specific day they want the mass said on, I check my calendar and if that day is free I fill in that day. If that date is already taken by a mass intention, I put it on the closest available day for that church. If the date isn't important and they ask for next available, I keep a list and fill in the weekly mass schedule on a rotation. Clear as mud? Great!

Next, why are mass intentions important? Well, since the mass is the highest form of prayer, there are many graces to be had from a mass intention. From Catholic.org: "The reason that this tradition has been passed on for centuries is because of the many spiritual fruits that result from this form of prayer. The celebration of the Eucharist is the highest form of worship in the Catholic Church because we unite ourselves with Christ's sacrifice on the cross in worship of his Father. St. John Paul II emphasized the graces that come when a Mass is offered. 'The Church believes that she will be heard, for she prays in union with Christ her Head and Spouse, who takes up this plea of His Bride and joins it to His own redemptive sacrifice."

Also, did you know that masses can be offered for the living, as well as the deceased? Here are some words of wisdom on that:

"One Mass before death may be more profitable than many after it." -St. Leonard of Port Maurice

Offering mass intentions is an old tradition, one with many graces and blessings, let us not forget to carry it on.

FR STEVE WILL BE GONE THIS WEEK. Fr will be gone from April 20-27 to visit with family. Our loyal secretaries will still be having the usual office hours, and Fr. Tony Shonis, a recently retired priest with the Diocese of Owensboro, will be filling in for weekend masses only. Because of the visiting priest, mass on Saturday, April 24 will be inside. Outdoor masses on Saturday will resume when Fr. Steve returns.

NEW MASS TIME ON MONDAY MORNING: Because of a shift in coronavirus protocol, we cannot, for the rest of the school year, allow the public to be at either Monday or Thursday morning masses. To compensate for this, we will be offering mass on Monday at 9 AM also, for the public. This is an experimental trial. If there is interest in this, we will continue this until the end of school year.

<u>PARISH COUNCIL NOMINATIONS</u>: At the entrance of church (both churches) we will have a box to put nominations for Parish council. Half of our parish council people will be stepping down as of July, and we will need four more people from each parish. We ask you to prayerfully consider who would be a good candidate for this position. Elections will be in May. You may nominate yourself or someone else.

YARD SALE COMING UP IN JUNE: On June 4 and 5, St. Paul will once again be having It's yard sale. We take pretty much anything, except old TV's. Those who are doing Spring cleaning might want to start saving up your things to throw away.

<u>FIRST COMMUNION COMING UP</u>: First Communion will be celebrated on Sunday, May 9, at the 8:30 AM mass at St. Paul, and at the 10:30 Mass at St. Elizabeth. Each child will receive first communion in their own parish. We encourage (not as a mandate, but as request) people who do not have a child or connection among the first communion children to go to another mass besides the 8:30 mass at St. Paul, so as to not overload the attendance at these masses.

<u>FIRST RECONCILIATION</u>: We will be having first reconciliation for children from both churches on Sunday, May 2, at St. Paul Church, at 1:30 PM.

CONFIRMATION: Confirmation will be held this year as a joint St. Paul/St. Elizabeth mass, at the request of Bishop Medley. This will be held at a special time at 12:30 PM, at St. Elizabeth Church. Let us pray for all of our young people who are preparing for this sacrament.

<u>POSITIONS OPENING AT ST PAUL</u>: We have openings next year for a grade school teacher, as well as a bus driver with a CDL. We ask you to pray that the Lord will once again bring the right person to us, as He always has. Anyone interested is asked to talk to Fr. Steve or the school office.
