## Pastor's Corner

Easter Sunday

April 4, 2021

### EASTER SUNRISE SERVICE

As of the writing of this pastor's corner, I have no idea how the sunrise service is going to go. I may have 6 people there, I may have 50. It may be a beautiful morning, it may not. I may actually get up when my alarm clock rings, or I just may not. Who knows. But I am really psyched for it, even though I am not much of a morning person. But it is one of those things that I have said for years that I am going to do, kind of like bungee jumping. I only went to one. It was well after sunrise, and it was indoors, and it was not in a Catholic Church, so it wasn't the same. This is the real thing. These are so appropriate, mainly because that is the time of day that the women found the empty tomb. The very act of seeing the sun come up just as they saw "the Son come up" is so meaningful. I am just happy to be able to celebrate in this beautiful way.

### DIVINE MERCY CHAPLET AND HOLY HOUR

It really is only in the past ten years, that I really came to know anything about the Divine Mercy prayer, novena and holy hour. But the very teaching of it fascinates me. First there is the emphasis on the mercy of God. This is such an absolute central part of why we are Christian that it tends to be oversimplified at times. The knowledge that Jesus WANTS to give us his mercy (despite others refusal to accept it). But also the fact that each of us NEEDS to pray, not just for our own mercy, but that of the world, is huge. The fact is that you and I (and our prayers) are what can get some people into Heaven. That is a big responsibility. I hope that you will take part in the novena, and if possible, join us for the holy hour. The salvation of souls depends on it.

### EVANGELIZATION TEAM- I HAVENT FORGOTTEN

No, I definitely have not. I have some people in mind that I would like to ask about this, but if you are interested, please let me know. I would love to have you. This thought scares people. What does it involve? Well, it is asking for those who are truly committed to their Catholic Christian faith. Is that you? No, it does not involve knocking on doors and giving out brochures, nor does it involve preaching to people (though it is great if you want to). Mainly it is about this- I personally need help in my efforts to reach out to others and show them the faith. What I need is your IDEAS, your prayers, and your perspective. I need young people, old people, men and women, to give me understanding of what we ought to do in sharing Jesus Christ and his church with others. I have wrestled with this a lot myself, and what I find is a need to have other people to meet, pray, advise and encourage myself and others in our efforts. These are to meet solely with the end game (though not just the immediate) of sharing our Catholic faith. Yes, there will be more on this later. The spread of the faith started at Pentecost, but it did not end there.

**CONFIRMATION:** Confirmation will be held this year as a joint St. Paul/St. Elizabeth mass, at the request of Bishop Medley. This will be held at a special time at 12:30 PM, at St. Elizabeth Church. Let us pray for all of our young people who are preparing for this sacrament.

**CONFIRMATION PARENTS NOTE:** If you have not done so yet, please contact Fr. Steve regarding setting up a time to have your son/daughter have a confirmation interview with Fr. Steve and their CCD teacher.
