Fifth Sunday of Easter May 2, 2021

AUDREY BRANGERS, COMING TO CHRIST AT THE RIGHT TIME

This past week, Audrey Brangers passed away from a not-so-long battle with cancer. As you may know, Audrey entered St. Elizabeth Church through the waters of baptism just this past Easter. I myself will really miss Audrey. She was so incredibly enthused with her participation in RCIA this year. She was just like a little kid, soaking up everything that we discussed in class. She greatly valued her opportunity to be part of the Catholic church and to finally enter into sacramental life.

Her job was not to be involved in chicken dinners, Bible study, and senior lunches. No, her job is to pray for us from Heaven. Yes, we did not lose a member, she only transferred to another parish, so to speak. May she now rest in peace with the Lord. God bless you.

We encourage (not as a mandate, but as request) people who do not have a child or connection among the first communion children to go to another mass besides the 8:30 mass at St. Paul, so as to not overload the attendance at these masses.

<u>FIRST RECONCILIATION</u>: We will be having first reconciliation for children from both churches this Sunday, May 2, at St. Paul Church, at 1:30 PM.

CONFIRMATION: Confirmation will be held this year as a joint St. Paul/St. Elizabeth mass, at the request of Bishop Medley. This will be held at a special time at 12:30 PM, at St. Elizabeth Church. Let us pray for all of our young people who are preparing for this sacrament.

FR ED BRADLEY REINSTATED WITH PRIESTLY FACULTIES: It was just announced this past week by Bishop Medley that Fr. Ed Bradley has had his ability to celebrate mass, and most other priestly faculties reinstated, effective immediately. While he does have some limitations on his activities, the Vatican has exonerated him of the sexual abuse allegations.
