Pastor's Corner

Sixth Sunday of Easter May 9, 2021

AFTER MASS SOCIAL AT ST ELIZABETH- BECAUSE WE CAN AND SHOULD

On Sunday, May 23, after the 10:30 mass, we will be having a social at St. Elizabeth Church. I want to invite and encourage ALL of our families to be there for this. I really feel like this is a very important event. Even though it may seem like a chance to just get together and eat hamburgers and the like, it is really a test of whether we have community, and whether we can bring back community to our St. Elizabeth parish, after by and large having community life suspended for the past year. People in our parish have, to varying degrees, shuttered themselves in throughout the past year because of fear of COVID. I personally haven't really done so, but I can understand those who have.

OK, fast forward to May 2021, and we are coming out of it. People have, by and large, returned to mass, and even more so returned to work, shopping, school, restaurants, and social life. Yes, I understand that there are exceptions, but the loosening of restrictions and people's own choices have shown that we are returning to normal life, sometimes even amidst various restrictions, guidelines, and rules.

So, that being said, let us, as a St. Elizabeth community, ask ourselves: Will our community life make a recovery from this, or have we let the pandemic indefinitely ruin our communal spirit? Was this past year a fluke, or is it a sign of the future?

While these events weren't always the best attended in the past, the fact that this is the first real social event that we have had in over a year should draw a bigger crowd than ever, IF we truly do have a community life on the back end of the pandemic.

So what are we having to eat? To answer a question that has been brought up- NO we are NOT asking people to bring a dish to pass. Current regulations STILL do not allow u to have a buffet-type pot-luck dinner. (Hopefully, that will change, but that is the state of the situation for now). We will be cooking up burgers and hot dogs, and providing other food and drinks, and we will give them out to people in pre-packaged meals, rather than having a line to get food.

It will be outdoors, if at all possible. Tom Lilly, chancellor with the Diocese of Owensboro, just this week sent and update saying that "Parishes and Schools <u>MAY</u> choose to <u>NOT</u> require a mask during OUTDOOR activities if the group size is less than 1,000. This applies to the Liturgy, picnics, playgrounds, sporting events, youth groups or any other outdoor activities. " Thus, we are good to go on this. It is a good time of year to set up tables outside and have our meal out there.

Activities at this event (other than eating) are to be announced. Come out and join the parish in building (or, rather, REbuilding) community.

As for St. Paul Parish, I hope that we will also be planning a similar outdoor social event there soon as well. More on that to come.
