UPDATE OF LAMPTON FAMILY HOUSE PURCHASE

Just a few words to fill you in on the status of the house purchase. The St. Paul Parish Council met this past Monday and made the decision to go ahead and purchase the land and the house. It will be purchased for \$70,000. As of now, the school plans to contribute \$25,000 toward the purchase, and St. Paul Parish has agreed to contribute \$20,000 toward this. The Tri-parish Council also met recently and agreed to contribute \$5000 toward the purchase of the land.

At the moment, the Parish Council of St. Elizabeth is still getting feedback on this question. While there is no set-in stone amount, some of you were wondering what was meant by a “significant contribution” to the purchase means. The figure thrown around for St. Elizabeth was \$10,000. We feel that this is warranted by the fact that this community school has educated and led a significant number of St. Elizabeth Parish students in recent years. The windfall that we will soon receive from the Gilbert Clemons inheritance will also help us a good bit. Before, it was brought up that some of this should be given to the school, among other projects (just which project that means it to be open for discussion). This will be dealt with in the upcoming parish council meeting.

Thus the parish/school is moving forward with plans to close on this purchase. We are dealing with the family, the diocese and the parish in terms of getting things signs and getting the money together for this. The plan is to ultimately tear it down and build the new school addition on that sight. Depending on our fund-raising efforts and the progress of the building committee, we will see exactly when it gets torn down. But this is the ultimate end game of what we are doing. Keep us in your prayers that we will have the Lord's guidance in all that we do.
