CLARIFICATION ON ST. PAUL SCHOOL BUILDING FUND COLLECTION

As you likely know, there is a monthly collection at church for the school. We appreciate your support that you give to us on not only this collection, but for St. Paul School in general. The school collection that will be taken on June 8 will be a bit different than the usual monthly collection.

The local churches have agreed to have a collection specifically for the St. Paul School Building Fund on the 5th Sunday of every month. This is somewhat similar to the monthly building fund collections that St. Paul parish used to have for its project. A couple of months ago, we talked about our need to raise some \$350,000 for the building. We have at present raised some \$150,000 for it, and we hope for your continued support. That original 350K figure has jumped up significantly due to the recent surge of inflation for building materials (and just about everything else), but the fact is that we are still raising money.

I do realize that, for some of you, there is an overlap in the requests for your giving. Some of you are also being sent (or have been sent) alumni appeal letters for the same very thing. These letters are also to keep you updated on all that is happening. Some others of you have given in other ways. Know that we very much appreciate your generosity.

But I do ask you to please be generous in helping us to achieve this momentous growth in our school. We cannot do so without the help of our Catholic community.

Because of a conflict with a previously scheduled diocesan collection (Diocesan Communications), this quarterly collection will be pushed back to the first Sunday in June, rather than it being on the 5th Sunday

UPDATE ON DONATION TO ST PAUL SCHOOL At the parish council meeting at St. Elizabeth this past week, the council decided that St. Elizabeth parish will in fact contribute \$10,000 to the purchase of the house/land to build and addition to St. Paul School. This purchase will be made soon, and we are working on closing on the property

UPCOMING ST PAUL BUILDING PROJECT COLLECTION: Being as a fifth Sunday is coming up, we will be doing the collection to gather money for the St. Paul School addition.
