# Pastor's Corner

Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time June 26, 2022

### **ASK PADRE- QUESTION #1**

Question- Why should those not in full communion with the Catholic Church still attend Catholic mass regularly? Furthermore, how do we as a parish welcome them?

This is a great question, and it is also a question uniquely problematic for the Catholic Church more than others. At most churches, people get invited to one's church, they come and they take part in the service- they sing, they hear preaching, etc. As for the Catholic Church, we can do the same thing, but then when it comes time for the Eucharist, they cannot take part. So what do they do about that? If they can't fully participate, why come? Well, the answer does not have to be that complicated really though sometimes people's sensitivities complicate this. People still need community, people still need prayer, worship, and to hear that word of God, both the reading of the gospel and the preaching. There are many people who come to church every week, even though they do not receive communion. This may be the result of something in their lifestyle that keeps them out of a state of grace, it may be a lack of having received the sacraments of initiation, or maybe they are too young. Either way, keeping your connection to the church community is essential, even for those who are not able to receive the Eucharist.

In some cases, a person who cannot receive communion is in a state of the "NOT YET." In other words, some are in the process of making their journey back to full communion with the Church. Perhaps preparation (such as RCIA) or the choice to make a commitment to the Church, or in some cases simply needing to look at their lifestyle. The church does not reject these people, and in whatever state one is in, the church welcomes, ministers to and teaches. Our doors are open to all.

In some cases, this is a sensitive issue. Some may feel judged, whether it is because they are not Catholic, or because something about their lifestyle is not accepted. The Church never wishes to shut people out. But at the same time, the Church has no function if it is not to direct people's lives and actions to the teachings of Jesus Christ. Just in the same way that you would not want a doctor who neglects to address your unhealthy habits that are the cause of your physical issues, you would not want a church (I hope) that refuses to address actions you may be doing that are leading you away from the Church, from Jesus Christ, and, in the end, endangering your very salvation. To answer the question that Cain asked, "Yes, we are our brother's keeper."

So, yes, it is very important even for those who cannot receive communion to still take part in the mass. They are even able to participate as lectors, or in most other ways. I commend people who worship with us, even without partaking of the Eucharist. Whether it is someone who may never receive the Eucharist again, or someone who simply can't go to Communion this week because they need to go to Confession. It is very commendable. We are to welcome them, accept them and help them grow in their faith.
