FINANCIAL GIVING: A CALL TO ALL OF US

Yes, this Pastor's corner is about money. No, this is not by any means the most important part of being a Christian, but tithing is in fact the goal of all of us, to the extent that we are reasonably able. As you see in each week's bulletin, there is a set amount that we need each week to keep the parish running. And how much is that for each family? Well, at St. Paul, we need an average of \$1122.24 per family, while at St. Elizabeth we need an average of \$1677.05 per family

How much do our families give? Well, let's look at this
