## Pastor's Corner

Sixth Sunday of Ordinary Time

February 12, 2023

### MY EXPERIENCE AT THE PRIEST CONVOCATION

As I had mentioned a couple of weeks ago, the priest convocation was a positive experience, and it was good to get the priests together, though it was the first time in 3 years, due to the COVID outbreak. The main speaker spoke on the liturgy, and the importance of following it well, and properly. Throughout the meeting, as I listened, I realized that there were some minor things that I myself have done wrong. Not being a real detail-oriented person, I myself can be careless about things. While not a huge deal, and generally through the fault of nobody but my own carelessness, it is good to have the correct method of celebrating the mass. So, thus below are some of the things that I myself learned about minor things that we need to change in our mass:

- \* the processional cross is not to be kept in the sanctuary, since there is already a crucifix on the wall. It is to be taken back to the sacristy after the procession
- \* After receiving communion in the hand, the person is to consume it IN FRONT of the priest or Eucharistic Minister, not to the side.
- \* Anyone who gives a talk at the end of mass about upcoming events, or church news, is not to give it from the ambo, but rather some other place. They may use the microphones from the choir, for example (unless it is Rich Wygant. He doesn't need microphones).
- \* Lectors need to be Catholic
- \* The Eucharistic Ministers are not to come up to the altar until after the priest has consumed the Body and Blood of Christ
- \* Also, for our parish, to clarify. People are to sit after the Eucharist is put in the tabernacle, NOT after the priest is seated
- \* Those who have received Holy Communion during the course of the mass is NOT supposed to genuflect on the way out of Church. Since the Eucharist is within his/her own body, it does not make sense to bow to a Eucharist somewhere else.

\*Also, another thing I learned is that, when the priest during the course of the mass, holds his hands out to pray at the altar, this is supposed to mimic the position of the hands of Christ on the cross, as the priest is now doing the sacrifice

\*Further, it is important that the Eucharistic minister should put the purificator on top of the corporal (Square cloth), rather than just laying it anywhere on the altar cloth

\*Those who come to church who have not been baptized are NOT supposed to dip their hand in the holy water as they enter church, since this is done in remembrance of our baptism. It does not matter in what faith they were baptized, but they should only do it if they were baptized.

Again, these are not huge deals, but in celebrating the Mass, it is important to do things as the Church calls us to do this as reverently as possible.
