Pastor's Corner

Second Sunday of Ordinary Time January 14, 2024

IN PRAISE OF ORDINARY TIME

For the first time in a while, you are seeing me wearing Green in masses, now that the Christmas Season has passed, and we are in ordinary time. So what is so great about this time of year, which many may see as sort of "garbage time", the time that nothing special is happening. But there are two realities of it: One of these lies in the fact that, yes, there are in fact some special things that happen in Ordinary Time, special feasts like All Saints and All Souls Day, the March for Life, Corpus Christi, and many more.

But even more so than that, it is a time to realize that we are with the Lord even in the every day, run of the mill activity that we do throughout the year. To love someone, especially Jesus Christ, is to be with them not just on the days of great celebration, or even the days of great mourning, but also, well, on days that we just celebrate Jesus because he is Jesus. Those who come to church only on days like Christmas and Easter are like someone who talks to their father only on his birthday, or one who only celebrates their friendship when the friend has some great accomplishment, or like one who only cheers for a football team when they get to the Super Bowl. So take advantage of Ordinary Time to build up your faith in Jesus not because of some special event, but simply for the greatest reason that we celebrate him- HE IS LORD.

THE POPES MESSAGE ON SURROGATE MOTHERHOOD

Pope Francis, this week, gave a speech to a group of foreign ambassadors from various nations. In this speech, he talked about a whole bunch of current events and issues that are going on in our world. He talked of the need of peace in Palestine and Ukraine, and other places. He also talked about the environment, artificial intelligence, and human exploitation.

But of course, the big news is that he firmly condemned the "deplorable" practice of surrogate motherhood. He states that the practice, which now regularly involves artificial forms of fertilization, is "exploitive" and violates human dignity of both the mother and the child, and makes the child and "object of trafficking."

This should not be surprising, nor is it a new. The church's emphasis on the sacredness of the unborn child, as well as the sacredness of marriage, has been done since ancient times. This teaching, while ancient, was clearly and succinctly expressed in Pope John Paul II's extensive work "the Theology of the Body." This states the absolute essential link between three sacred entities: 1) the marriage covenant 2) sexual union and 3) openness to child bearing. All three of these are treated in a rightly sacred dignity if and only if all three of them are included. This is why the Church has always condemned contraception and sterilization, because it leads to a physical union closed to life. Likewise, surrogate motherhood separates childbearing with the sacred marital union, and makes it a mere method of production of humans.

Human dignity and the dignity of the child, the mother and the marital covenant are things that are greatly defamed in our culture today. As Christians, we are to carry out God's plans as he gives it to us, accepting the call that He has for us.
